




# Immigration in Brief

Note: Beginning in March 2020, monthly totals combine apprehensions and explusions into a new category known as encounters. Monthly totals before March 2020 include apprehensions only.



"I have not received word from Chicago, Cook County, or the State on this issue. Neither [Village] elected officials nor staff were consulted or contacted about this decision, and we are now gathering information to keep our community updated." Mayor (9/8/22)







# Federal Control

### **→** Local Impact

"The State has a prior relationship with the hotel, who has done amazing work welcoming refugees and asylum seekers before. It is interesting that local officials are choosing this specific instance to gripe to the press about this specific group of asylum seekers that consists of about 30 families. Illinois is a welcoming state and xenophobia has no home here." Gov. Pritzker (9/9/22)





### **Organizational Takeaways**

- Get your communications plan in order now to help you later
- Develop trust and open lines of communication with community members to solve problems
- Don't do it alone; empower your staff
- Know your community to be able to craft thematic messaging
- Identify the assets in your network that can help

- Mow your organizational assets, including staff perspectives
- Leaders will meet the challenges which arise when they are authentic
- If you try and BS your way through a problem, you will not solve it
